I feel as though the policy makes sense when used in lab practicals or actual assessments of our abilities. With that in mind I feel as though the progression system is completely out of line in the COVID times. We are already barely in classes, and now we are responsible for being our own instructors. I also feel as though the general tone of the program is lacking in some self awareness. As I said previously we are in unprecedented times and some members of the faculty do not respect this. If there is a program wide problem, maybe it isn't the student's fault? One last note is the use of trick questions or vague wording of test questions. How is this of any help to us students? All it does is confuse and cause second guessing, this in no way shows actual retention of information. All in all I am happy with the program, especially Dr. Varner-Soden, who is beyond helpful and an excellent instructor.
