JOHNSON COLLEGE CHALLENGE EXAM

Students who believe they have adequate knowledge or skills in a subject area through prior academic coursework, military service, non-credit training, work experience, etc. and who do not have transcripts documenting that learning may be eligible to sit for a Johnson College Challenge Examination.

To complete a course under this policy, a student must meet with the appropriate faculty member and/or academic advisor to determine eligibility, then submit a Challenge Examination form (available through the Office of the Registrar) to the Director of Academics.

Students seeking credit for courses by this method must arrange for testing to take place prior to the end of the third week of classes.

Challenge Examination

Eligibility:

- 1. Participation is limited to matriculated students at Johnson College.
- 2. Students must not have previously attempted Credit by Examination for the course.
- 3. Students must not have a grade for a higher-level college course in the same subject or have passed any course for which the challenged course is a prerequisite.
- 4. The Challenge Examination is requested and completed prior to the end of the third week of the semester.

Application and Fees:

- The <u>Challenge Examination form</u> must be signed by the student, Program Director, Director of Academics, Student Business Office, and Registrar.
- The fee for the Challenge Examination is the cost of one credit of tuition (\$580 for the 2024-2025 academic year) and must be paid prior to the exam being administered. Fees are non-refundable and must be paid at the Business Office. The fee will be waived with proof of veteran status.

Credit:

• Successful completion of a Challenge Examination will be identified on the student's transcript as transfer credit for the course.

Additional Information:

- Credit by Examination credits may be included in the Credit Residence Requirement.
- The college will not allow more than three full-course equivalents completed by Challenge Examination to count toward a degree, unless the Director of Academics approves a request based on a demonstrated hardship.
- Each department determines the courses for which it will offer Challenge Examinations.
